SAN FRANCISCO PERFORMANCES ANNOUNCES 2022-2023 SEASON

San Francisco, CA, March 15, 2022 – San Francisco Performances (SFP) has announced details of its 2022-2023 season, including debuts by J'Nai Bridges and Ulysses Owens Jr, Sean Shibe, Dreamers' Circus, JIJI, Danny Driver, and others; plus the return of Midori, Sir András Schiff, Dawn Upshaw, Catalyst Quartet, Garrick Ohlsson, Trio Mediæval, and more.

The 32-performance season runs **October 7, 2022, through May 10, 2023,** with performances at Herbst Theatre and St. Mark's Lutheran Church in San Francisco. **Subscriptions**, priced \$120 to \$330, including Guitar, Chamber, Great Artists and Ensembles, Piano, Art of Song, Saturday Morning, and PIVOT, plus a Make-Your-Own Series option, go **on sale March 22,**

2022. Single tickets, priced \$45 to \$105, go on sale August 9, 2022. For subscriptions, tickets, and more information about the season, visit <u>sfperformances.org</u>.

The season represents the past, present, and future of the ever-evolving art form of chamber music, bringing together artists from many traditions and backgrounds for shared music making. We look forward to many memorable performances."

The season features San Francisco Performances debuts by 17 artists and ensembles, including: mezzo-soprano J'Nai Bridges with jazz percussionist Ulysses Owens Jr.; baritone Benjamin Appl; Chiaroscuro Quartet; Junction Trio; the Benedetti/Elschenbroich/Grynyuk Trio; Doric String Quartet; Modigliani Quartet; guitarists Andrea González Caballero and Grisha Goryachev; guitarist Sean Shibe with the Van Kuijk Quartet; Dreamers' Circus; guitarist JIJI; and pianists Danny Driver, Adam Tendler, and Víkingur Ólafsson.

San Francisco Performances 2022-2023 Season by Series

Art of Song

Dawn Upshaw with the Brentano Quartet, presenting *Dido Reimagined* January 12; the return of Trio Mediæval April 20; SFP debuts of J'Nai Bridges and Ulysses Owens Jr. April 28; and the debut of Benjamin Appl with pianist James Baillieu May 10.

Saturday Mornings

Music Historian-in-Residence Robert Greenberg with the Alexander String Quartet, October 8 and 22, January 28, February 18, and March 11. This season, the five look back to the tumultuous social and political era of the early 20th century – times not unlike our own – and explore enduring works of great music it produced.

Chamber

The Danish String Quartet October 26; the Chiaroscuro Quartet (debut) April 1; the Modigliani Quartet (debut) April 5; and the farewell tour of the Emerson String Quartet April 14.

Great Artists and Ensembles

The debut of the Junction Trio December 1; two recitals by Midori February 2 and 5; the debut of the Benedetti/Elschenbroich/Grynyuk Trio March 22; and pianist Benjamin Grosvenor with the debut of the Doric String Quartet April 26.

Guitar

The debuts of Andrea González Caballero and Grisha Goryachev December 3; the debut of

Sean Shibe with the Van Kuijk Quartet February 10; Dreamers' Circus (debut) March 3; JIJI (debut) March 11; and Jason Vieaux with Sasha Cooke April 8.

The Guitar Series is presented in association with OMNI Foundation for the Performing Arts.

Piano

Garrick Ohlsson and Apollon Musagète October 7; the debut of Danny Driver November 8; Adam Tendler (debut) and Jenny Lin November 19; Lise de la Salle April 19; and the debut of Víkingur Ólafsson May 9.

PIVOT Festival

This is the eighth year of the PIVOT Festival, created for adventurous audiences seeking unique arts experiences. In 2023, the Catalyst Quartet returns for season two of its highly regarded *Uncovered* series, exploring the music of composers whose works have rarely been heard. February 21, 22, and 23, 2023, with guest artists Anne-Marie McDermott, piano (February 21), and Marcy Rosen, cello (February 22).

Each PIVOT Festival concert will be preceded by PIVOT Preludes, pre-concert programs in which pianist Sarah Cahill and other Bay Area artists will take a deeper dive into the works of a composer featured in that evening's performance.
