SAN FRANCISCO, CA – November 29, 2023 – San Francisco Performances (SFP) continues its 44th season in January 2024 with a thrilling lineup of exceptional artists – from the beloved and familiar to those making their SFP debuts – all presenting thoughtful, personally curated programs.

Our first performance of the new year is also the first in a three-part series created by pianist **Jonathan Biss**, who has asked contemporary American composers of three generations to consider and musically respond to the legacy of Franz Schubert. The **January 18** *Echoes of Schubert* program includes a new work by **Tyson Gholston Davis**, who has been commissioned by an astonishing array of artists and ensembles, including the Juilliard String Quartet and Eighth Blackbird. The **March 14** program features a new work by **Alvin Singleton**, who draws inspiration from a wide range of genres, including folk and spiritual, classical and pop, with often surprising and theatrical nuance.

The series ends on **May 2** with a program which includes new music by **Tyshawn Sorey**, whose work often melds composition and improvisation.

This season marks the ninth year of our **PIVOT Festival**, created for adventurous audiences interested in unique arts experiences. This season, PIVOT's Guest Curator is composer/musician **Gabriel Kahane**, who brings **Attacca Quartet** and **Roomful of Teeth** to our stage to dig deep into music that asks enduring and enlightening questions about our ever-changing world and seeks the uplift of answers rooted in shared experience. Kahane writes: "Roomful of Teeth and Attacca Quartet make music at the highest level, and with the utmost humanity. It will be a rare privilege to see them share a stage, and it is a thrill and honor for me to participate in some of the music-making." PIVOT runs from **January 24 - 26**.

The Alexander String Quartet continues its popular Saturday Morning Series with Robert Greenberg, SFP's Music Historian-In-Residence, on January 27. In *Music as a Mirror of Our World: The String Quartet from 1905 to 1946,* the quartet and Greenberg have been exploring in music and words some of chamber music's most intriguing and important composers, their works, lives, and times. The series continues on March 2, March 23, and April 27.

January 27 marks the SFP debut of mezzo-soprano **Raehann Bryce-Davis**, an alum of the Merola Opera Program who has made the opera and concert world sit up and take notice of her abundant energy and magnetic style. A gifted singing actress, she has a distinctive point of view in recital programs that bring together voices and stories old and new that resonate with love and courage, resilience, and humanity.

Pianist **Javier Perianes** has maintained a lifelong passion for music ignited during his childhood in a small village in Spain. He is among the most acclaimed pianists of our time, and his performances are infused with energy and excitement that powerfully draw listeners into his world of freshness and wonder. He returns to SFP on **February 7**.

How we listen to classical guitar—and what we listen to—we owe in part to the Romero family, and **Pepe Romero** has been among its most active and influential members. This solo recital on **February 10** celebrates his 80th birthday and more than seven decades on the professional stage. This program is presented in association with OMNI Foundation for the Performing Arts.

Our first Gift Concert of the season features three up-and-coming artists playing together as a piano trio: **Jonathan Swensen**, cello, **Stephen Waarts**, violin, and **Juho Pohjonen**, piano. This **February 15** performance, dedicated to the memory of long-time SFP Trustee Frank S. Bayley, is free to SFP Season subscribers and donors; tickets are \$45 for the general public.

Every performance by violinist **Leila Josefowicz** is a revelation of new things to be heard and felt in the familiar and a happy introduction to new sounds from less familiar creative voices. **John Novacek** is "a pianist well worth keeping an ear open for" (*Fanfare*). On **February 24**, they'll pair up for a program of music by Debussy, Szymanowski, Stravinsky, and Erkki-Sven Tüür.

Pianist **Pierre-Laurent Aimard** returns to SFP on **February 27** with a program which includes works by Mozart, Beethoven, C.P.E Bach, Chopin, and others. Throughout his remarkable career, Aimard has been the pianist of choice of leading composers as collaborator and interpreter.

It's hard to keep eyes and ears off the accomplished and charismatic tenor **Lawrence Brownlee**. On **February 29**, Brownlee and pianist **Kevin Miller** bring their Grammy©-nominated *Rising* project to our stage. This program of songs set to poems of the Harlem Renaissance illustrates Brownlee's commitment to connecting to people through his selection of repertory and musical storytelling. "I want people to feel like they're listening to someone who has something thoughtful and meaningful to say," writes Brownlee.

March 5th brings an inspired collaboration between one of the most distinctive pianists in the world and a dynamic string quartet that's drawing praise from critics and audiences worldwide. Pianist Sir **Stephen Hough** pairs up with the **Castalian String Quartet** to explore cherished chamber works by Haydn and Brahms, along with one of Hough's own compositions.

The **Calder Quartet** returns on **March 16** with an innovative program featuring the Bay Area's **Urban Jazz Dance Company** and its founder/director **Antoine Hunter**, a superbly gifted choreographer and well-known advocate for the Deaf community. In *The Mind's Ear: Motion Beyond Silence*, Hunter and company express their experience in a hearing world through dance, with music by Beethoven, John Cage, Jessie Montgomery, Caroline Shaw, and Julius Eastman.

Tenor **Ilker Arcayürek** is widely praised for his gilded tone, dramatic flexibility and captivating presence. **Simon Lepper** is an authoritative and polished pianist who is the perfect counterpart to Arcayürek's radiant technique. On **March 21**, the two perform works by Beethoven, Schumann, Hahn, Mendelssohn, Strauss, Brahms, Fauré, and others.

April 16 marks the return of the wildly popular **Ukulele Orchestra of Great Britain**, the runaway hit of our 2021-22 season. This cheeky ensemble scores with audiences with its unique, energetic blend of arrangements from pop to classical, humor, and, of course, lots and lots of expert strumming.

In the second of our Gift Concerts this season, **Camille Thomas**, **cello**, performs. She is praised for blending a brilliant command of the cello with a rare musicality in her passionate and compelling performances. (**April 23**.)

Named one of the greatest string quartets of the last 100 years by *BBC Magazine*, the **Dover Quartet** is one of the most versatile and in-demand chamber ensembles. They're joined by beloved pianist **Leif Ove Andsnes** and his commanding technique on **April 25** for a program of works by Turina, Dohnányi, and Brahms.

Our 44th season wraps up on **May 3** with a thrilling evening of music by two close friends and multi-talented artists, **Gabriel Kahane** and **Pekka Kuusisto**. This promises to be a wide-ranging and centuries-spanning musical event. At its center is the world premiere of a collaboratively written song cycle exploring the joys and griefs of life in the 21st century, around which Kuusisto and Kahane are building an eclectic program ranging from Bach and Nico

Muhly to Scandinavian folk music and songs from Kahane's catalogue.

We also champion a new generation, committed to building a contemporary and equitable repertoire. Performers like the Catalyst Quartet, violinist Jennifer Koh, tenor Lawrence Brownlee, and pianist/composer Vijay lyer are moving their art into the present and future, making it accessible to younger audiences while converting many traditionalists to new possibilities. They represent the path forward.
