SAN FRANCISCO, CA – August 14, 2025 – San Francisco Performances (SFP) has added a new event to its upcoming 46th season: a special Halloween night performance by the Kronos Quartet and acclaimed pianist Timo Andres, which will include works from the Philip Glass score for the classic film *Dracula*. This performance will also include selections from Bernard Herrmann's iconic score for *Psycho*, selections from George Crumb's *Black Angels*, the World Premiere of a new Edward Gorey-inspired piano work by Gabriel Kahane, and other works perfectly suited for a thrilling Halloween. Tickets for this special event will go on sale August 27, when single tickets for all 2025-26 season performances go on sale.

SFP's 46th season opens on **Friday**, **September 26**, with beloved tenor **Mark Padmore**, one of the great song

interpreters of our time, performing works by Robert Schumann. He'll be accompanied by frequent collaborator **Paul Lewis** on piano.

The following morning, **September 27**, the sensational **Esmé Quartet** makes its debut in SFP's popular Saturday Morning performance and lecture series, with **Dr. Robert Greenberg** providing commentary and context in his singular, engaging style. Greenberg is celebrating his 25th anniversary as our Music Historian-in-Residence this season. Together, he and the Esmé bring chamber music alive in a unique concert/lecture format, and will explore the works of Franz Schubert, including *Death and the Maiden*. The series continues on October 18, November 15, and December 13.

On **October 10**, father-son composer/musicians **Jeffrey Kahane** and **Gabriel Kahane** pair up for this season's fundraising gala benefitting San Francisco Performances' arts education programs. Their program will include the West Coast premiere of an arrangement of Gabriel Kahane's concerto for piano, *Heirloom*, written for his father, plus additional works for two pianos. The Gala includes a pre-concert cocktail reception (6pm), a concert (7pm), and a post-concert dinner. Gala tickets start at \$500; concert-only tickets are available for \$75/\$65/\$55.

October 11 marks the opening of our three-concert Contemporary Chamber series with the innovative **Attacca Quartet**. For this performance, the Quartet will perform works by Haydn, Bartók, and David Lang. Later in the season, they'll collaborate with vocalist Theo Bleckmann (February 27) and violinist/soprano Caroline Shaw (April 12).

The superb pianist **Conrad Tao** returns to SFP on **October 17** with a wide-ranging program which will include music by Rachmaninoff, Schumann, Stephen Sondheim, and Irving Berlin. His program is rooted in his fascination with Rachmaninoff's relationship to popular music.

Young guitarist **Meng Su** is already well known to SFP audiences for her performances as half of the Beijing Guitar Duo. On **October 18**, she brings her artistry to a solo program including works by Bach, Tárrega, Sérgio Assad, and a World Premiere by Viet Cuong.

Young German-English baritone **Benjamin Appl** and pianist **James Baillieu** were a sensation of our 2022-2023 season. On **October 24**, they return with a program honoring Appl's mentor, the great baritone and conductor Dietrich Fischer-Dieskau, with songs by Schubert, Brahms, Tchaikovsky, Clara Schumann, Albert Fischer-Dieskau, Klaus Fischer-Dieskau, and others.

The Grammy© Award-winning **Los Angeles Guitar Quartet** is one of the most multifaceted groups in any genre. On **November 8**, these four uniquely accomplished musicians bring their bright energy to the concert stage with a program that is likely to range from Bluegrass to Bach.

The vibrant and popular **Modigliani Quartet** returns to SFP on **November 14** with a compelling program that includes works by Kurtág, Haydn, and Beethoven. The Modigliani is one of today's most sought-after quartets.

The Romeros represent three generations of standard-setting guitarists who continue to deliver performances that are exciting, innovative, and deeply satisfying to guitar aficionados and music lovers of every kind. They return to SFP on **November 22** with an extensive program of works by Vivaldi, Granados, Bizet, Boccherini, De Falla, and others, including a World Premiere by Douglas J. Cuomo, performed with guest soprano Amy Goymerac..

More than any other artists, **Trio Mediæval** have popularized the music of 12th century composer, mystic, and philosopher Hildegard von Bingen, so it is fitting for them to devote an entire evening to her music. This powerhouse trio performs on **December 5**.
